Third Rail Repertory Theatre acknowledges that we live and work on the stolen ancestral lands of the Multnomah, Wasco, Cowlitz, Kathlamet, Clackamas, Bands of Chinook, Tualatin Kalapuya, Molalla and many other Tribes who made their homes, and continue to make their homes, along the Willamette and Columbia rivers. We acknowledge that the seizure of these lands was by forced and armed removal of these Indigenous communities. Portland's urban Native community is descended from more than 380 tribes, and there are nine sovereign Native American nations located throughout Oregon.

We acknowledge that Third Rail's administrative offices in the Alberta Abbey reside in a building that was historically a religious and community gathering place in a predominantly Black neighborhood, and that the Black community members of the Albina district have been displaced through decades of systemic racism. It is important to note that this displacement contributes to community violence.

We acknowledge that these words are meaningless without action to address the injustices in our community, and we hold ourselves accountable to act in service of dismantling the systems that feed racism and anti-Blackness.

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## FROM THE MANAGING ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

## DIRECTOR'S NOTE by Scott Yarbrough



Welcome to Third Rail's 18th Season! We are grateful to have you, and excited to share the journey ahead. You being with us, in our beloved little CoHo theatre space, is a true joy.

I want to stop and say it again. It is a true joy, and one we do not take for granted. Thank you.

This season we'll traverse some wonderfully varied terrain so please join for the whole thing. We'll settle in for a couple of pints at a local pub in Dublin where two old friends share familiar rituals and

ponder the mundane and profound events of daily life. Then we're off to post- 9/11 Newark and "thereabouts" as two young friends navigate all the tender and painful complexities of adolescence, while also living the realities of being undocumented immigrants who only know America as home. Finally, we'll find ourselves in a 1990's mall in Anytown, USA where four friends prepare for a karaoke contest while the new millennium approaches fast.

At the core of each play is friendship. The characters are all so beautifully different from one another, but their friendships, forged by time, place, and circumstance, are so recognizable. Their friendships offer a way for us to not only see into their stories, but to relish with them our messy, mysterious, and glorious shared humanity.

I hope to see you for all three shows but I am thankful for you being here right now. Enjoy!

I first became aware of Roddy Doyle in the early 90's when Alan Parker's screen adaptation of Doyle's first novel, The Commitments, somehow made it to the movie theatre in my hometown for one single week. I became obsessed and saw it three times during that run. When I spent the summer in London a few years later, I picked up a copy of the book and read the whole thing on a long bus ride from Stratford to London. I gobbled through the rest of the books in that trilogy and then started a habit of picking up his newest book as soon as it was published in the States. (I'm old enough to remember when it was near impossible to get books from the UK before they were published in America.) Before he became the voice of modern Irish literature (my claim), he actually wrote plays for his neighborhood theatre in Dublin. After the success of *The Commitments*, a pair of his plays was published. One of these plays, War, is set in a Dublin pub on Trivia Night as we follow the increasingly more intoxicated exploits of four trivia teams. It's one of my favorite plays and I hope to get a chance to see it or hear it read one day.

Flash forward several decades and Roddy's publisher was insisting that he start a presence on social media. Doyle created a Facebook account, but had no idea what to post, so he started writing small, fictional dialogues between two middle-aged men sitting in a pub and discussing the news of the day over pints. These dialogues started amassing a substantial following to the point where three books were published compiling years of these dialogues. In 2018, he decided to give these two characters a larger stage to play on (literally) and made them the focus of a new play, *Two Pints*, which he wrote for the Abbey Theatre. I'm no longer the young buck I was when I first read *The Commitments* and neither is Roddy. His compassionate portrait of two men wrestling with loss, and their search for how they might make the most out of the time they have, resonates with me at this point in my life as well as this world "post" -Covid. Thanks for letting us share their ridiculousness with you.

**RODDY DOYLE** (he/him) was born in Dublin in 1958. He is the author of ten acclaimed novels, including The Commitments, The Van (a finalist for the Booker Prize), Paddy Clarke Ha Ha Ha (winner of the Booker Prize), The Woman Who Walked Into Doors, A Star Called Henry, The Guts, and most recently, Smile. Dovle has also written several collections of stories, as well as Two Pints, Two More Pints, and Two for the Road, and several works for children and young adults including the Rover novels. He lives in Dublin.

## WORKING TOGETHER TO PRESERVE AND EXPAND A HOME FOR PERFORMING ARTS

For 26 years CoHo Theatre on NW Raleigh has been a vital resource for artists, and a reliable location for audiences. Prior to his death in November 2021, Philip Cuomo (CoHo's then Producing Artistic Director) had been working towards the purchase of the CoHo Theatre building, committed to its preservation as a center for performing arts in the community.

Inspired by Philip's vision and tireless work, Philip's family formed the Philip Cuomo Family Foundation in order to steward the purchase and renovation of the NW Raleigh Building. Three non-profit theatre companies with strong ties to Philip's work and vision, and ties to the building itself as a necessary asset — Third Rail Repertory Theatre, PETE (Portland Experimental Theatre Ensemble), and CoHo Productions - formed the Cuomo Theatre Collaborative to work closely with the Philip Cuomo Family Foundation in order to preserve Philip's legacy.

#### Mission

The mission of the Cuomo Theatre Collaborative is to secure a sustainable home for the performing arts at 2257-2259 NW Raleigh Street that provides space, resources, and opportunities to artists and audiences. Through a model of collective leadership, artist empowerment, and affordable access, this space will interrupt the gentrification narrative and integrate the arts as a necessary piece of community vitality in Portland's exploding Slabtown neighborhood.

#### Vision

Performance requires a place. A place to make, to practice, to gather, and to share a visceral experience. Smaller itinerant companies and independent artists are dependent on access to high quality, affordable performance, rehearsal, teaching, and office spaces. Over the last several years, venue after venue has closed or downsized. There is a scarcity crisis that limits opportunities. Covid has compounded the problem. There is no shortage of creative sparks lighting up Portland. They just need the right place to land, catch, and burn steady. The vision of the Philip Cuomo Family Foundation and the Cuomo Theatre Collaborative is to provide this place at 2257-2259 NW Raleigh Street.
